GRACE NOTES

Dear Friends,

Have you ever had those moments or days where there seems to be a clear demarcation between who you were before and who you are now? It may be tied to a joyful event like that of entering into a serious relationship, the start of parenthood, or your first real job. There may be subtle or significant changes from who you understood yourself to be and who you are now. Those mile markers in life can also be less celebratory, the death of a loved one, a traumatic event, or a significant diagnosis. The world around you is shifted.

It's a strange feeling to know that you are still you, but nothing is the same. We have many ancestors in the Bible who have encountered life altering moments. these Sometimes that even comes with a name change, Abram to Abraham, Sarai to Sarah or Saul to Paul. In some faith traditions you receive a new name at your baptism or at faith milestones. We affirm and celebrate friends and family when their names signify a new chapter for a couple at their wedding or as someone who identifies as trans embraces their new name. While receiving the honorific of "Pastor" isn't a name change, it is an immediate reminder each time it's used of who I am, who I am called to be.

Without a name change, these shifts in our lives aren't always easy for others to identify. The stranger will not know there is a version of you with a certain responsibility, purpose, or loss unless there is a symbol or tattoo that prominently tells your story.

Throughout this season of Lent we witness Peter's watershed moments. From leaving fishing behind to follow Jesus, to watching his teacher die after denying him. There are multiple moments where his wandering heart was changed or transformed. Going from 'Peter the rock' to 'Peter the denier'. Can you imagine how Jesus' resurrection would change his life forever? His world would never be the same.

What are the moments that have changed you in your faith? If you grew up going to church, it may be hard to even identify a life before or after understanding God's Grace. Perhaps it is in the other major moments in your life that God's presence was revealed in new ways because you relied on God in a new way. Coming to God in your joys, questions, doubts, and struggles. Perhaps, it is harder for those of us who grew up in the church and remained in the church to articulate and identify the difference our faith makes in our lives because we don't have anything to compare it to.

I invite you to consider your story, your wandering heart throughout the remainder of Lent. Where is God within your story and how are you different because of your faith? As we journey through Holy Week and celebrate Easter, will you be the same as you were before this year's journey began?

SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

With any skill, sport, or hobby, we often become better with practice. This season of Lent, Grace invites you to use three spiritual practices to help focus a wandering heart. Through these practices we hope you can find a way to connect with God and re-center your heart on the one who fills our hearts.

We invite you to **turn your hearts to God through prayer**. We have devotional booklets that contain art and reflection on the Wednesday night texts regarding Peter's faith journey. We will also be providing an opportunity to visit different prayer stations in March (see below).

EcoPalms

Did you know that Grace is using EcoPalms this Palm Sunday? By using Ecopalms we:

Promote Social Justice

- Harvesting palms is an important source of income but gatherers receive a low price.
- Gatherers will receive a higher price for their "fair trade" palms improving their income.

Promote Environmental Stewardship

- Palms protect valuable natural forests because they provide income to forest communities.
- Palms will be sustainably harvested and managed protecting the palms and the forests they need for shade

Why a "Fair Trade" Palm?

- To improve income and living conditions for the communities gathering the palm.
- To protect the palms and the important forests from which they are gathered through sustainable harvest programs.

Did You Know?

- Approximately 308 million palm fronds were consumed in the United States in 1998.
- Palm purchases for Palm Sunday may be worth up to 4.5 million dollars/year.
- Palm gathering actually protects valuable natural forests.
- At least half of the farmers in the Central Petenof Guatemala earn additional income from harvesting fronds and, more than a quarter of household heads support themselves exclusively by collecting fronds.

Come Read with a Child ???

Madison Elementary and Garfield Elementary are requesting adults to read with a child once a week. This commitment could be shared with another person so that each adult volunteers once every other week. This is an important way to meet the needs of our neighbors and make a measurable difference in a child's life. Just 30 minutes a week can help a child develop a lifetime joy of reading and this shows a child that there are adults in this community who care about them. When I've spoken with the principals at these schools, they report that the kids look forward each week to this time, which also encourages school attendance.

In addition, Garfield and Sudlow Junior High are requesting items that will support their effort to increase attendance and positive behavior. Small incentives have proven to be effective at increasing attendance and school performance. These small tokens can go a long way for a child!

- **Small toys** for children to earn as a special reward in their Positive Behavioral Interventions Programs and Support Program Store
- Monetary donations for a new office chair. There are six teachers at Sudlow who have not yet missed a day of teaching. The principal would like to have these teachers draw for a reward, such as a new office chair.

If you would like to donate any of the following items or if you would like to learn more about reading with a child, please speak with Pastor Kirsten. Connecting with the children in our community is discipleship. Christ's compassion and love leads us into the place where children are already learning. There are three months left of school this year – let's share in relationship with these kids and watch love and joy bloom.

FOOD PANTRY WEEKEND

Food Pantry Collection is Sunday, March 3 Bring your non-perishable food donations in a bag, and leave at the altar before the service.

- **Donations Needed:** nonperishables especially canned fruits and vegetables, canned & dry beans, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal)
- Always appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned meats, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables, items for baking (flour, sugar (granulated, powdered, brown), baking soda, baking powder, etc.)
- **Consider:** simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoon sets, hand-held can openers, aluminum foil pans (various sizes), cake mixes and frosting for special occasions
- Ethnic Cooking Supplies: There are a number of refugee families living in and around the Quad Cities that most likely frequent food pantries when needed, and foods commonly used within their ethnic culture are so very much appreciated (soy sauce, tortillas, ethnic seasoning mixes and spices, pitas, lard, etc.).
