# Dear Friends,

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. -**Romans 15:13** 

Weeks of preparation both spiritually and administratively leads to the Easter service. I always hope and pray all will go smoothly. We had so many volunteers involved in music that day that a less used music stand became the best option for my 'pulpit' at the late service. When I arrived at the sermon, I go to raise the music stand holding my sermon only to have the top of the stand pop off. I put it back on, then tried again and again it popped off. I could be frustrated, to be honest I was a little, but it was also funny. When all you want is for things to go well, sometimes we need to be reminded that it's okay if it doesn't. It was an, unintentional, preview to our Holy Humor service.

Perhaps you have had those moments where there seems to be a choice, you can let anger and frustration get the best of you or you can laugh and find the humor. I remember when I went to my dentist who was a bit of a serious fellow. I always found it a successful visit if I could make him smile or laugh. One time I went and after they discovered my front canine tooth was too far gone for a crown, I was told I would need to go to another doctor for a root canal. I began to laugh so hard I cried. You see, it was almost Halloween and at this point in the appointment all I had was a tiny


little peg for a tooth. I was sure I looked like a toothless pumpkin. Since it was a peg for tooth, in my mind, that made me think I might look like a pirate too. Those mental images and me saying, "arrr" like a pirate, had me cracking up along with the dentist. I'm guessing that was the first time he had that reaction to someone needing a root canal.

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary "Joy" is defined as:

- 1a) the emotion evoked by wellbeing, success, or good fortune or by the prospect of possessing what one desires
- b) the expression or exhibition of such emotion
- 2) a state of happiness or felicity
- 3) a source or cause of delight

I find the first part of the definition to be extremely lacking, its only surface level, perhaps better fit for describing happiness. ľve always happiness to be more fleeting and joy to be deeper. Perhaps, it's because in the first part of that definition, health, success, and good fortune are all temporary. They can all disappear. Yet when the source of our joy is deeper, rooted in God, we discover a joy that can endure. A joy that can coexist beside grief, loss, or despair. A joy that can sustain us.

Joy, happiness, and humor all inter-



speaking, essentially raising the question, "who is the jackass in this scenario?" (Numbers 22:21-39) or a young man who fell out the window because Paul was preaching too long (Acts 20:9-12). Even God recognized the value of laughter and humor.

As we gather on Holy Humor Sunday, we celebrate the joy of Easter. We laugh and indulge in the silly and the humor. We recognize that to others this faith journey may seem foolish. Yet, it is here, in God, we find joy.

# Quad City Interfaith + Davenport Community

On March 14, a public forum was held on the topic of a community ID for Davenport residents. Hosted by Quad Cities Interfaith, this forum was led by several community leaders who spoke in favor of a community ID. I attended along with Grace member, Sarah Peterson.

Sarah graciously agreed to share her thoughts on the forum. "I went in with a very limited understanding of how many people in our community would benefit from the Community ID. Among other things, the panel pointed out the numerous times we are asked to show an ID for things like picking up our children from school to applying for a job. It quickly became clear that there is a significant need for people from all walks of life to have access to an ID that is community-based and not tied to a driver's license.

The panel addressed a wide variety of people for whom this would be a valuable resource, including: the elderly population, those who are displaced by a disaster that has destroyed identifying documents, youth who are estranged from their parents and don't have access to documents necessary obtaining a driver's license or state ID, refugees who left with nothing, and the previously incarcerated who want to reintegrate into community. They also mentioned the idea that the information on the card could include language spoken, health concerns, and emergency

contact information that could benefit anyone in the community finds themselves in emergency. In addition, having a Community ID creates a sense of pride and belonging that can benefit everyone."

I share Sarah's surprise with how many people would benefit from a community ID. In addition to all whom Sarah mentioned, this could benefit children as they walk home from school or our elderly neighbors who no longer need a driver's license. Unlike a state ID, a community ID doesn't require a separate photo ID. I was also surprised to hear that several communities have already implemented community IDs, including Moline, IL. Community ID cards are government-issued photo IDs that show identity and residency

Open a credit union account or cash a check Pick up pharmacy prescriptions Return items to a store Pick up grandkids from school Interact with hospitals and law enforcement

Community IDs have more flexible requirements than state IDs or drivers licenses. They fill in the gaps and help Davenport residents get back on their feet.

#### **FOOD PANTRY WEEKEND**

**Food Pantry Collection is Sunday, April 7** Bring your non-perishable food donations in a bag, and leave at the altar before the service.

- **Donations Needed:** nonperishables especially canned fruits and vegetables, canned & dry beans, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal)
- Always appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned meats, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables, items for baking (flour, sugar (granulated, powdered, brown), baking soda, baking powder, etc.)
- **Consider:** simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoon sets, hand-held can openers, aluminum foil pans (various sizes), cake mixes and frosting for special occasions
- Ethnic Cooking Supplies: There are a number of refugee families living in and around the Quad Cities that most likely frequent food pantries when needed, and foods commonly used within their ethnic culture are so very much appreciated (soy sauce, tortillas, ethnic seasoning mixes and spices, pitas, lard, etc.). # From Sheep to Shepherd: An LSI Early Childhood Services Story

Amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a mother, recently released from treatment, found herself in her new empty apartment with her son. She felt lost and needed a shepherd to guide her. So, Hali

contacted LSI's Early Childhood Services, and Gretchen O'Brien, a Family Support Worker, answered the call. Gretchen began virtual home visits using the Healthy Family America home-visiting model.

For the next three years, Gretchen connected Hali and her son to community resources, served as a support system and a shoulder to cry on, and celebrated Hali's sobriety milestones with her. Even when Hali doubted herself, Gretchen guided and believed in her.

"I just remember sitting in that empty apartment crying, but I had Gretchen on the phone. You guys believed in me when nobody else did," shared Hali.

Today, Hali serves on the Healthy Family America (HFA) National Parent Advisory Committee, the first of its kind. The group is composed of 10-12 parents from around the country who have graduated from their local HFA program, each participant with their own story to share.

Hali needed a shepherd in her time of trouble and self-doubt, and Gretchen answered that call. Now, Hali serves as a shepherd to thousands of parents through the National Parent Advisory Committee. The LSI Early Childhood team couldn't be more proud of Hali and Gretchen.
