Dear Friends,

One of my favorite parts of worship is the sharing of the peace. When the assisting minister says, "The peace of Christ be with you" I picture a flow of energy from them to all of us worshiping. Followed by our returned response, "And also with you." In my mind I imagine Van Gogh's 'Starry Night' and the swirling motion of the skies. It's a gift, a promise, an act of reconciliation and an invitation.

Throughout the Gospels we hear Jesus and God's messengers offer peace to those they encounter. One notable occasion is when Jesus greets the disciples after having been raised from the dead. In a room, scared for their safety, Jesus enters in and greets the disciples, "Peace be with you!" (John 20:19, 21). Peace to the ones who abandoned him, peace to the one who betrayed him, peace to his frightened followers. It doesn't erase what's been done or what may come, but I imagine it would be a relief to hear those words, reassuring even. He then breaths onto them the Holy Spirit, the one who will accompany them throughout their lives and ministry.

Before we share in the Meal, we receive Christ's peace. Much like the disciples we receive the gift of grace and forgiveness in those words. We too have come up short throughout the week, but we are still granted

peace and welcomed to the table. Yes, we each carry burdens that may have the potential to consume us. What a gift to receive Christ's peace spoken unto us, reminding us that there is something greater than our worries. Perhaps even providing us peace for our minds and spirits, even if just for a short while.

The sharing of Christ's peace is a ritual that reminds us we are not alone. Not only do we receive Jesus' peace and the presence of the Holy Spirit, but we also have the community with whom we share this gift of peace. As we shake hands, wave, hug, or fist bump, we are offering more than a friendly salutation. We provide Jesus' comforting words and presence. A blessing and promise given in earnest. We also have an opportunity to reconcile ourselves with one another. If there is a disagreement, it is a moment to offer grace and remind ourselves of the one who unites before us coming Communion (Matt 5:23-24).

I love how at Grace we often leave our pews to share the peace. At the 10:30am service, it often feels like a conga line where nearly every person leaves their pew as they can, and each person is greeted. A few weeks ago, I watched as two children who shared the peace with such enthusiasm! The joy they brought those they greeted was radiated



back to them and others. Were they aware of the history to the liturgical practice, the scriptural references, or theological significance? Probably not. Yet in their joy, they participated in this community by sharing Christ's peace.

I hope, like those children, we can embrace the peace of Christ with joy and overwhelming enthusiasm. Not only within worship but within our daily lives. May we carry Christ's peace out into the world, sowing the seeds of peace within our relationships and community (Luke 10:1-11, 16-20).

After many discussions, the Council is excited to invite you to a congregational meeting on July 27 at 9:30am. This will be the final step towards updating our Endowment. Our hope is to increase the impact our Endowment can have within our community. With this change we anticipate more resources and support for those who wish to donate. Providing a clearer path toward growing the Endowment. The amended Constitution will also allow for the Council to be more responsive to the changing needs and ministries within our congregation. While the creation of a Reserve Fund will provide a resource that will grow as it is invested like the Endowment. When needed, it will be an option for unplanned building expenses or exceptional ministry opportunities.

Between services we will vote on the proposed amendments to the Constitution leading to the proposed changes. 

Food Pantry Weekend

Our next Food Pantry Collection is Sunday, August 3 Bring your non-perishable food donations in a bag, and leave at the altar before the service. Let's make this our best year yet!

Ethnic and Multicultural Cooking Supplies: Go to imu.uiowa.edu/food/food-pantry/donate/multicultural-food-item-donations-requested for a detailed list of commonly requested multicultural food items.

Donations Needed: nonperishables - especially canned fruits and vegetables, canned & dry beans, canned meats, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal, etc.)

Always Appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables (donated directly to the pantry), items for baking (flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, etc.)

Consider: simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoon sets, hand-

held can openers, aluminum foil pans (various sizes), cake mixes and frosting for special occasions
