Dear Friends,

"I've long gotten this wrong. We don't 'bring' people to Christ. Rather we encounter Christ in each other. When we bridge the distance between ourselves and another, we meet the one by whom we both are held." ~ Pastor Michael Ostrom

I've been pondering this quote ever since I read it on social media. I'm sure I may have uttered a version of this expression at some point in my life. What do we, or others, mean when we say we are bringing people to Christ? Do we think we are introducing them to Jesus? How often is that phrase used because we think something is missing or wrong in someone's life and we believe they need to change?

Throughout scripture, we often hear of someone outside of the worshiping community who brings valued lessons and insight about God. Sometimes seeing God more clearly than those who are sitting at Jesus' feet. Rahab, Ruth, the Maji, or the Roman Centurion at the foot of the cross. They are all outsiders who end up blessing the people of God even though they are not formally of the Hebrew or Christian faith.

Which is why I struggle with the inherent presumption in the word "bring;" that we take someone to

meet Jesus. Perhaps I am overthinking the semantics, but to bring someone to Jesus suggests they weren't already surrounded by God. That Jesus and the Holy Spirit aren't already active in someone's life.

God works on a grander scale then we will ever perceive. Consistently choosing the non-traditional and unlikely character to bring about God's promises. So, what if we reshaped the phrase and its intent. We bring God's peace, justice and mercy into the world with us. Not because God is not already at work, but because we have been sent and invited to do so. As the church and individuals, we are the hands and feet of God. Wherever we are, at work, the store or among friends.

We share God's story, reminding folks of God's compassion and grace. We witness to how we see God active in the people and places around us.

We bring with us open hearts and minds waiting to encounter Christ in another. In the words of Pastor Ostrom, "we bridge the distance between ourselves and another."

Manny Lopez and his band will be here to lead our worship in song and jazzy celebration. This is always a popular service, and we look forward to seeing you there!






LWR School Kits Fabric Kits Personal Care Kits

Ethnic and Multicultural Cooking Supplies:

Go to imu.uiowa.edu/food/food-pantry/donate/multicultural-food-itemdonations-requested for a detailed list of commonly requested items.

Donations Needed: nonperishables - especially canned fruits and vegetables, canned & dry beans, canned meats, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal, etc.)

Always Appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables (donated directly to the pantry), items for baking (flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, etc.)

Consider: simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoon sets, hand-held can openers, aluminum foil pans (various sizes), cake mixes and frosting for special occasions
