Dear Friends,

Years ago, I asked a confirmation class to choose two words, among a list of many. They were to select the words that described how it feels or what it looks like to be a part of and witness to the kingdom of God. The top four chosen were - forgiven, invited, included, loved. Following that came the words - affirmed, embraced, given dignity, made whole. This lesson and these words remained with me. I wonder, which words would you select and why?

Feeling forgiven, invited, included and loved at first glance might seem easy and obvious. Not all that radical for the kingdom of God. But have you ever encountered someone who carries a grudge? Maybe you have held on to past hurts yourself. A world, a kingdom, without forgiveness seems like a place where everyone is stuck. I imagine it would be a world without peace or hope. We all have caused harm intended or not. We perhaps know what it is like to not be forgiven or to not forgive ourselves. In God we experience the radical nature of forgiveness. In Jesus forgiveness is modeled, an example of how we may try and find it for others. This key ingredient to the kingdom of God leaves space for one's pain to be named while providing a way forward.

Invited and Included also seem like easy things to do. With the start of school, I am reminded of how stressed kids and teenagers, even college students are. Generally, their primary concern is not about the classes they are taking. They worry about whether they will be included and invited by others. I've heard those same concerns echoed by adults. I don't think this desire ever truly goes away.

The kingdom of God is a radical venture if we are to truly invite and include all within a community. It challenges us to stretch ourselves and see others through the loving eyes of God. I believe one of Grace's strengths is welcoming people to our community. In a few weeks we will host a Block Party for our church and our neighbors. While it is an opportunity for people to get to know us, it is also a chance for neighbors to feel connected. It's a way for us to create a place where the kingdom of God is represented in how we invite and include those in our midst.

A few weeks after the confirmation students choose these words. I attended an event hosted by United Way. On a sunny Sunday afternoon people gathered from the Somalian, Hispanic, and Anglo communities. We started by dividing up by generation. Then we were asked a series of questions including that of: Who wants to feel safe in their community? Who wants to feel as though they belong in their community? Who wants to feel a part of their community? To all these questions and more everyone raised their hand showing us that we are all beginning with the same goal and need. I heard echoes of the words that exemplify the kingdom, we all

want to feel invited, included and loved.

As we broke into small groups for discussions of how we can work toaether and strengthen community we were able to create relationships across different cultural backgrounds. We began to dream about how we can work together. While we talked, folks I had only known for a few minutes offered to bring me a drink or dessert. People from different cultural backgrounds compared their foods as if trading recipes. The kids present shared their hope for a community that shows compassion to others as we celebrate and recognize differences. Again, those words describing the kingdom of God resounded in my heart and mind.

We get glimpses of the kingdom not yet fully realized. You, dear people, have hopefully witnessed it. You have been invited, included, loved, and forgiven by God. You, church, filled with the love of Jesus, are sent to participate in God's creation of the kingdom here on earth. "A new society, a renewed Israel open to all... a realm of God's extravagant grace, mercy, forgiveness, and compassion... a place where those labeled unworthy or impure are received unconditionally... a world of abundant manna shared by all... a reality worth dropping all other commitments to joyfully receive." ~Daniel Erlander





Why Use Rain Barrels?

When rain hits concrete—roads, buildings, parking lots—it runs off, often causing flash floods and flooded basements. Rain barrels are one way to prevent some of the runoff from ending up in your basement.

According to River Action, using a rain barrel is one of the simplest actions you can take to reduce runoff by collecting the rain that runs off your home. Collected rainwater can be used to irrigate lawns, water landscape beds or wash cars. Rain barrels also reduce storm water runoff lessening the impact on storm sewers, local streams, and rivers.

River Action in Davenport sells rain barrels as do several hardware stores in the area. Many rain barrels are made from recycled materials, thus not only preserving the rain but also reusing materials that would end up in a landfill. Rain barrels are a win-win for everyone.
