If it's shabby and I haven't chosen to wear it in a year, it's served its purpose. If I'm wise, I might begin the practice of when I add a shirt to my closet, I take one out.

I wonder, if this approach would be useful in more areas than just sorting the stuff in our lives. Might it also have application to how we spend our time and who we spend it with.

Are there activities that just don't fit us? Though they seemed good at the time, they just don't suit us like we thought they would. Are there things that served us for years but no longer make sense for who we are today? Commitments, hobbies, and relationships that have served us well and brought us great joy. Yet, you can't help but notice, you no longer look forward to them. They just don't make sense for where you are in your life today.

As you add new things to your life, what might you need to remove to make room for it? There is only so much of ourselves available to give to others and our activities.

Sometimes we need to acknowledge something has served its purpose but now needs to end to make room for a new thing.

These aren't always easy questions to ponder for yourself or conversations to have with others. It's not uncommon for there to be some grief as one let's go of a hobby or tradition to adapt to how one's life and abilities have changed.

As we approach a birthday or a new year, it is an opportunity for prayerful reflection. We can take time to ponder where God has shown up throughout the year. We can ask the Spirit to guide us as we look ahead. We may ponder 'what might we need to give thanks for and let go of'? What might we need to make room for in the year ahead? Where does God fit into the ways we spend our time?

I practice this each year as I approach my birthday, and I create a list of things I want to try in the year to come. The list isn't intended to become one more thing I must accomplish. Instead, it allows for intentionality. It invites God into the conversation. As we enter a new year, I invite you to have this conversation with yourself, your family, and most especially, with God.

Chalking the Door: An Epiphany House Blessing

Adapted from Darryl Moresco

The family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance, 20 + C + M + B + 26. The letters C, M, B abbreviate the Latin words *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2026 is the year.

Instructions for Blessing the Home on January 6

Using the chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows: 20 + C + M + B + 26 while saying: The Magi followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and fifteen years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Then offer the following prayer:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

"Chalking the Door" is a way to celebrate and literally mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions the Latin words, *Christus Mansionem Benedictat*, "May Christ bless the house."



Always Appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables (donated directly to the pantry), items for baking (flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, etc.)

Consider: simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered

milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoons, hand-held can openers, aluminum foil pans), cake mixes for special occasions
